- 2. Demand for highly skilled employees is increasing rapidly. Entry-level jobs requiring master's degrees are expected to grow by 17 percent through 2026, the fastest growth of any education level. By earning your master's degree, the likelihood of moving into a leadership position increases to 85%. Unemployment rates for those with a master's degree are consistently among the lowest in the nation.
 - 3. Make a difference in your community. Focus on leadership, service and building relationships that turn into a lifelong network. Graduate programs perfect the skills that increase your opportunities within various organizations and with future employers.





QUAD STATE SCHOLARSHIP

Students from *AR*, *KS*, *MO*, *TX* are *eligible* for an 80% non-resident tuition waiver. Students who reside in campus housing are eligible for a 100% non-resident tuition wavier (*may not apply to all programs).

TRIBAL HERITAGE SCHOLARSHIP

The benefits include a stipend and a tuition waiver for 6-credit hours per fall and spring semester. The types of assistantships include the Teaching and Graduate Assistantship.

Graduate Student Worker positions are similar to the assistantship, but do not include the tuition waiver. GSW positions can work up to 29 hours per week.







ALTERNATIVE CERTIFICATION FOR EDUCATORS (ACE) INSTITUTE

ALTERNATIVE PLACEMENT PATHWAY

Seeking Alternative Teacher Certification in grades 5-12 requires a minimum of 6-18 hours.

Provides candidates with non-teaching degrees an opportunity to teach in Oklahoma accredited schools, secondary or PK-12. PK-12 applies to art, music, health and physical education and foreign languages. Completion of this pathway earns the Classroom Teaching Certificate.

Eligibility:

- » A bachelor's degree with a minimum 2.5 GPA
- » An academic major that relates to the certification area, or an academic minor in a field that corresponds to the certification area
- » At least 1 year of qualified work experience that relates to the certification area

Professional education hours required by the State must include a college credit course in classroom management and a college credit course in pedagogy.

Required Professional Education:

Classroom Management (Must complete the following):

» EDUC 5283 - Teaching Methods

Pedagogy (Select one of the following):

- » EDUC 5463 Differentiated Instructional Strategies
- » EDUC 5633 Learning Centric Educator

ELEMENTARY CERTIFICATION IN GRADES 1-8 VIA HB 2748

Seeking Alternative Teacher Certification in grades 1-8. Requires a minimum of 18 hours. Provides candidates an opportunity to become certified in elementary education before completing the certification exams.

Eligibility:

- » Hold a bachelor's degree from an accredited college/university with a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA or hold a terminal degree.
- » Two years of post-degree qualified work experience in a corresponding field to Early Childhood or Elementary.
- » Must have your district initiate the application process.
- » Complete a sequence as follows:
 - » First Year 6 Hours Classroom Management, Reading Instruction
 - » Second Year 6 Hours Child Development, Math Instruction
 - » Third Year 6 Hours of Professional Education


